- Coaching delivered face to face, online and via telephone. Coaches operate from various locations across the region that support community access.
- Mindfulness group program a 5-week program delivered in community languages with a self-help component via
 translated guided meditation recording for use between sessions. The program is tailored to Arabic speaking and Bangla
 speaking community members who are 18 years and older. Groups are divided by gender to ensure cultural
 appropriateness and acceptability and delivered in suburb locations where population warrants a community language
 approach.

These activities were enhanced using COVID-19 Emergency Mental Health Support funding. Further activities included commissioning of a perinatal support worker to support CALD women in the perinatal period connect to mental health and community supports, workshops on wellbeing for the Chinese speaking community, psychoeducation and resilience workshops for young women from CALD backgrounds, and care coordination support to enhance a counselling service. The expected outcome is increased access to low intensity services available for people experiencing mild forms of mental illness in the region.


