Gastroenterology CNC

The CNC provides a Virtual clinic, Nurse led model, for rapid assessment of patients with a positive faecal occult blood test (FOBT), per rectal bleeding or other symptoms/history pertaining to bowel cancer. The CNC assesses the patient and allows direct patient access to endoscopy lists within a timely manner and in accordance with national cancer screening guidelines. The CNC then follows-up with the patients post scope, and liaises with the GP's to discuss results, and bypass Gastro out-patient clinics. The CNC also books direct access colonoscopies for patients requiring their follow-up colonoscopies according to adenoma/polyp surveillance guidelines.
