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Strengthening Care for Children (SC4C) CPD activities

The Strengthening Care for Children (SC4C) project will run in your practice for 12 months. The model will involve:

- weekly GP-Paediatrician co-consulting sessions for 6 months, followed by fortnightly co-consulting sessions for another 6 months.
- . monthly 60 minute in-practice case study discussions
- business day email and phone support to participating GPs



1. GP- Paediatrician co-consultations

40 x CPD Accredited Activity Points (formerly CAT 1): Supervised Clinical Attachment (SCA)

GP- Paediatrician co-consults provide an opportunity for a Supervised Clinical Attachment (SCA). SCA is an opportunity for GPs to use the supervised environment to investigate, learn and improve knowledge and skill in a manner that is unique to them. It is designed to provide an individualised and hands-on learning experience, where the scenarios and problems come in the form of real cases.

Structure of SCA:

Contact hours can be delivered face to face or in a combination with other media such as videoconferencing, case study discussion over phone or email.

Criteria specific to SCA activity:

- minimum of 10 hours contact with supervisor
- name and qualifications of supervisor to be recorded
- session summaries including details of sessions using de-identified patient data

<u>Each co-consulting session should be 30mins duration</u>. These sessions can be accumulated towards the minimum 10 hours contact with supervisor. The duration of other media sessions, as noted above, may also be accumulated towards minimum 10 hours (if applicable)

Recording:

This activity will be recorded as a self- directed CPD Accredited Activity.

This activity has not been accredited with RACGP for CPD points by the Provider on your behalf

Follow login steps for self directed log (noted in Appendix A)

- a. Select "Supervised clinical attachment" heading/link to access required forms
- b. Download Resource
 - a. SCA Guide to familiarise yourself with SCA requirements
 - b. SCA Template log for recording the activity

Submitting:

Once activity is finished and log completed, follow "How to record "steps to lodge notification. This involves completing online application form and attaching completed template/log.

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2. Monthly (60mins) case discussions

12x2= 24 CPD Activity Points (formerly CAT 2): Provider- led CPD activity

Paediatrician- led case discussions will be held monthly (60-minute duration) at the GP practice. GPs and other allied health clinicians are invited to discuss paediatric cases.

These case discussions provide an opportunity for all clinical staff to discuss and review cases with a paediatrician to learn and improve knowledge and skills regarding paediatric management.

Criteria for case discussions:

- SC4C participating GPs are required to attend each monthly meeting.
- · record attendance at each meeting
- completion of an evaluation form post session

Recording:

This activity will be recorded as a **Provider-Led CPD Activity**.

This activity has been accredited with RACGP for CPD points as a Provider-Led CPD Activity. The Provider (CESPHN) will submit on your behalf.

Submitting:

Upon completion of each monthly activity, CESPHN (within four weeks) will upload your attendance for allocation of your points, after which the points will appear on your CPD statement


1. Login to your RACGP dashboard at https://www.racgp.org.au/login
