

# Request for a Free Screening Mammogram

for women aged 50 to 74 years

1 in 8 women will develop breast cancer in their lifetime. However, finding breast cancer early improves survival. A breast screening mammogram can detect cancers before they can be felt or noticed.

It is important that women over the age of 50 have a mammogram every 2 years.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Women aged 50 to 74 years

BreastScreen NSW actively encourages asymptomatic women aged 50 to 74 years to have a free screening mammogram every two years. Screening mammograms have been shown to be of significant benefit, in terms of deaths prevented, for women in this age group.

### Women aged 40 to 49 years

Free screening mammograms at BreastScreen NSW are available to women aged between 40 to 49 years who wish to attend. Women are directed to discuss this decision with their GP.

## Women aged 74 years and older

BreastScreen NSW provides free screening mammograms to women aged 74 years and older. While screening is of benefit, women in this age group may have other health priorities. Women are directed to discuss this decision with their GP.

#### What about women with symptoms?

BreastScreen NSW is for asymptomatic 'well' women with no signs of breast cancer. If a woman has any unusual breast changes, she should be examined by her GP and referred for a diagnostic mammogram if required. For more information about signs and symptoms go to BreastScreen NSW website.
