## Join the Bowel Cancer Screening Project

Central and Eastern Sydney Primary Health Network (CESPHN) has partnered with The Daffodil Centre (a joint venture between Cancer Council NSW and the University of Sydney) to conduct a research project which aims to:




- To increase the involvement of general practice teams in promoting the National Bowel Cancer Screening Program (NBCSP) and
- Ensure patients undergo bowel cancer screening in line with clinical guidelines.

#### The study will:

- **run for 9 months** commencing in September 2024, with the intervention administered in February 2025 and trial completion in May 2025.
- recruit **100 General Practices** from four sites in Australia (including 25 practices in Central and Eastern Sydney). These practices will be divided into intervention and usual care arms.
- be supported by project-funded Clinical Trial Coordinators (CTCs). The role of the CTC is to engage with and support participating practices.

#### What does the intervention involve?

- The intervention arm will implement a multicomponent intervention over a **4-month period** to improve participation in the NBCSP.
- The intervention was developed through an ongoing co-design process with GPs and practice staff in Australia.
- We estimate that GPs and practice staff will spend up to two hours per fortnight on project related activities over the 9-month period.



- The trial is funded by the NHMRC (*Grant number: 2021/GNT2014964*) and has ethics approval from the University of Sydney Human Research Ethics committee.
- Participants will be supported to access Continuing Professional Development points (RACGP, APNA) as a result of their involvement in the trial.
