

# COVID-19 Vaccination Reminder Program for Adults aged 75 years and older

Vaccination remains the most important way to protect those at risk of serious COVID-19 disease.<sup>1</sup>

The risk of serious illness from COVID-19 increases with age.

Current ATAGI advice recommends a dose of COVID-19 vaccines for adults ≥ 75 years every 6 months.¹

The aim of this program is to remind patients who are at high risk of severe COVID-19 disease due to their age, as vaccination still remains the best way to protect them from hospitalisation or death from COVID-19.

### **Background**

ATAGI updated their COVID-19 guidelines on 22 November 2024 to include JN.1-containing vaccines for both primary and additional vaccinations. <sup>1,2</sup>

## PRACTICE BRIEF

This patient recall program will enable General Practices to conduct an SMS recall of patients who are eligible for a free COVID-19 vaccination, funded on the Australian Government.

#### How are patients identified?

The recall program is deployed via GoShare which allows an authorised practice staff member to send a recall message to patients aged 75 years and over, whose last COVID-19 vaccination was  $\geq$  6 months ago.

The program can be activated within 24 hours, with a simple, secure software download. You will be allocated SMS credits and a practice staff member will be guided through the steps to create the patient list to send the recall SMS bundle out to eligible patients. It only takes 15 minutes of a practice staff member's time to complete the activity.

#### What do patients receive?

Patients receive a personalised SMS from your practice asking them to make an appointment with their doctor to discuss their eligibility for a COVID-19 vaccination.

#### The SMS contains:

- The practice name and contact number;
- A link to information to help the patient understand what why their age puts them at an increased risk of serious illness from COVID-19.
