# **Urgent Care**

An Urgent Care Service is a health service that provides short-term, one-off care for urgent health care needs that are not life-threatening. Medical care is provided for an illness or injury (such as mild infections, fractures and burns) that can be managed without visiting a hospital emergency department, but cannot wait for a regular appointment with a doctor.

Urgent Care Services are free for Medicare card holders and community-based asylum seekers.

These services are commissioned by CESPHN with funding from the NSW and Australian governments.

Urgent care is medical attention that is required within 2-12 hours for an illness or injury that is not life-threatening. If you need help faster than that (within 2 hours) your situation could be a life-threatening emergency.

# **Multicultural Navigator Service**

If you speak Mandarin, Cantonese, Arabic, Korean or Nepali, live in the areas of Canterbury,

Strathfield-Burwood-Ashfield, Rockdale-Kogarah or Hurstville, and are between the age of 18 to 65, there is a new service for you. The Bilingual Health Navigator service will help people access health and social

services in their spoken language. CESPHN has provided funding to Advance Diversity Services Limited to deliver the service, which aims to empower community members to connect with others and navigate and access health services and social support.

A team of part-time bilingual navigators provide one-on-one, in-language support to link clients into services to meet their needs.

This could include services addressing physical and mental health, financial counselling, housing, employment, gambling harm and loneliness.

People can reach out to talk to someone in their language and don't need a referral but the service will also accept referrals from GPs and other health professionals and community-based services.

This is a free service and a Medicare card is not required to access the service.
