

Flu Vaccination Recall Program for GP Practices 2025

This campaign is designed to help Practices improve flu vaccination rates for patients aged 65 years and over who are eligible for vaccination on the National Immunisation Program (NIP):

Background

Influenza (Flu) is the most common vaccine-preventable disease in Australia. Flu symptoms can be mild, but severe cases can require hospitalisation and even cause death. Influenza-associated mortality rates are highest among adults aged ≥65 years. Vaccinating elderly people reduces hospitalisations from influenza and pneumonia, and all-cause mortality.¹ Despite this, only 61.7% of people aged 65 and over received a flu vaccination in 2024.²

This patient recall program will enable General Practices to conduct an SMS recall of patients aged 65 years and over who are eligible for a free Influenza vaccination, funded on the National Immunisation Program (NIP) that have not already received an influenza vaccine in 2025.

How are patients identified?

The recall program is deployed via GoShare, which allows an authorised practice staff member to send a recall message to a target group of patients, who are eligible for the flu vaccine.

The program can be activated within 24 hours, with a simple, secure software download. You will be allocated SMS credits and a practice staff member will be guided through the steps to create the patient list to send the recall SMS bundle out to eligible patients. It only takes 15 minutes of a practice staff member's time to complete the activity.



What do patients receive?

Patients receive a personalised SMS from your practice asking them to make an appointment with their doctor to discuss their eligibility for a flu vaccination.

The SMS contains:

- The practice name and contact number;
- A link to information to help the patient understand more about flu, how it can affect them and why they may be at increased risk.
