How can GPs support Breastfeeding?

Doctors are in a position of TRUST and Credibility. Asking about breastfeeding d**uration**, instead of **intention**, galvanizes where we stand on the benefits of breastfeeding. 97% of mothers initiate breastfeeding in this facility. Exclusive breastfeeding is encouraged.

For those mothers who "**decide**" to formula feed, we support them and inform them with advice from <u>Raising Children</u> on formula selection, preparation and bottle feeding.

Parents who intend to **Mix feed** need information and support as this method leads to early unplanned weaning and low supply. Mothers who "intend" to breastfeed are encouraged to "establish" breastfeeding before introducing formula. It can take up to 6 weeks to establish breastfeeding.

RHW Antenatal Breastfeeding Counselling

Referral criteria are broad and includes previous breastfeeding challenges, hx of breast surgery and breast hypoplasia.
