Why supervise UNSW medical students?

What's involved?

Your role as a GP supervisor

Our most urgent need is for supervisors for our new Year 4 longitudinal placements where students attend your practice for a half-day each week across the academic year.

There are also opportunities to:

- Host a Year 3 student for a short-term clinical placement, or
- Supervise a final-year (Year 6) student during their internship preparation program, where they'll work alongside you as an 'Assistant in Medicine' in the months leading up to graduation.

This sustained experience allows students to immerse themselves in primary care throughout the Medicine Program, enabling students to build strong relationships with their supervisor and deepen their understanding of General Practice.

As a supervisor, you'll provide a mix of clinical teaching, case discussions, feedback and both direct and indirect supervision. Many students establish strong rapport with their supervisors which can lead to a long-term mentoring relationship. Your broader team — including nurses, allied health professionals and administrative staff — also plays a valuable role in the student's learning.

Whether you prefer part-time involvement or a full-time teaching block, we'll work with you to find a placement model that fits your practice and preferences.

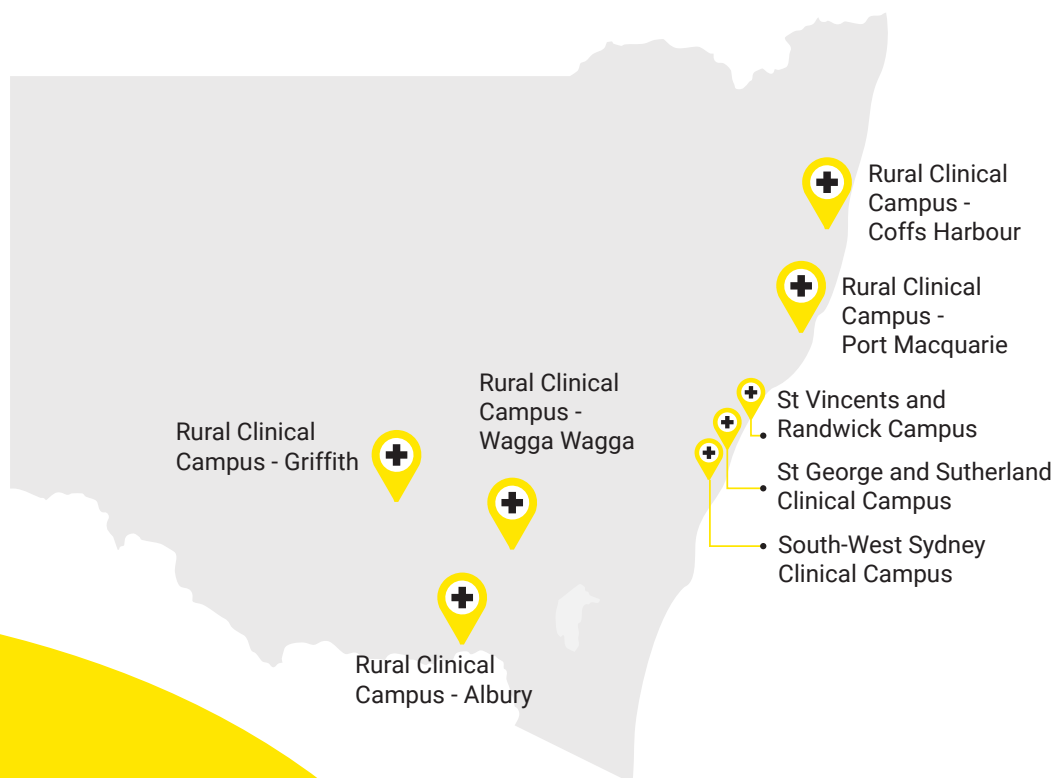
To be a supervisor, you must be a vocationally registered GP working in a fully accredited general practice.

We are seeking GP supervisors across metropolitan Sydney and rural NSW, particularly in areas near our rural clinical campuses: Albury, Coffs Harbour, Griffith, Port Macquarie and Wagga Wagga.
