Education is targeted to identified areas of need, including clinical assessment, management of devices, delirium, pain, and wound care. DMIC is a fast-paced day-only unit with an emphasis on admission avoidance. Patient appointments are available for a diverse and specialised range of services including Intravenous medications such as antibiotics, medications for chronic auto-immune conditions and drugs on the "lifesaving drug program"; blood product transfusions including SClg; wound dressings and day procedures such as ascitic taps, renal biopsies and bone marrow biopsies. The outpatient clinics service the whole hospital providing nursing and medical consults for both acute and chronic conditions and is where ultraviolet phototherapy is provided.

GASTROENTEROLOGY

Gastroenterology CNC

The CNC provides a Virtual clinic, Nurse led model, for rapid assessment of patients with a positive faecal occult blood test (FOBT), per rectal bleeding or other symptoms/history pertaining to bowel cancer. The CNC assesses the patient and allows direct patient access to endoscopy lists within a timely manner and in accordance with national cancer screening guidelines. The CNC then follows-up with the patients post scope, and consults with the GP's to discuss results, and bypass Gastro out-patient clinics. The CNC also books direct access colonoscopies for patients requiring their follow-up colonoscopies according to adenoma/polyp surveillance guidelines.

Movement Disorders CNC

The movement disorder nurse provides specialist nursing care for people living with a movement disorder. This includes people living with Parkinson's disease, Progressive Supranuclear Palsy (PSP), Multiple System Atrophy (MSA) and dystonia. The movement disorder nurse can be accessed at any stage through the disease process; newly diagnosed through to advanced disease progression. The clinical nurse consultant role supports people and their families living with Parkinson's and movement disorders by optimising their knowledge and understanding of treatments services and supports available. The movement disorder nurse works predominantly in the outpatient clinic and can provide support and education for inpatients when needed. The movement disorder CNC coordinates initiation and ongoing management of Duodopa a new device assisted therapy treatment offered at St. George hospital for advanced Parkinson's disease.
