Your CPD in 2023

From 2023, the Medical Board of Australia's Registration Standards require all registered medical practitioners to:

- 1. have a CPD home
- 2. record 50 hours of CPD annually, which includes a mix of:
 - educational activities
 - measuring outcomes and
 - reviewing performance
- 3. create a Professional Development Plan (PDP)
- 4. meet their CPD requirements annually

Activities for your CPD

We recognise that you are already doing CPD in your everyday work and professional activities.

This 'Activities for your CPD' guide has been designed to describe common CPD activities, providing guidance on which MBA activity type(s) they fit into, how you record completion of the activity and suggestions for the evidence that you may provide or retain relating to that activity.



You may also like to use this guide to help you to identify the activities that you are already doing and how they may be applied

as CPD or to plan the CPD that best suits your work style, your circumstances, and your scope of practice.


The MBA Activity types

Educational activities (knowledge and skills)	Activities that expand your general practice knowledge, skills and attitudes, related to your scope of practice. These activities will be very familiar and include learning opportunities like lectures, webinars, workshops, reading, podcasts and courses
Reviewing performance	Activities that require reflection on feedback about your work. Feedback might be from patients, peers or even from yourself. In each of these situations, you will receive information about your performance that can either validate what you already do or identify areas for improvement. Meaningful reflection on this information is where the learning occurs and can result in improved capability in your scope of practice
Measuring outcomes	Activities that use your work data to ensure quality results. When measuring outcomes, you use data from your work to show you are aware of current evidence and best practice in a particular area. You could achieve this by conducting activities like research, audits or evaluations. This type of learning can help you achieve high-quality performance in your scope of practice

Some CPD activities will fit neatly into one activity type, whereas others will be hybrid activities, having elements that fit into more than one activity type.

Activity guide

Click on any of the activities below to find out more about the activity, what activity type or types it may cover for your CPD, suggestions for similar activities, how you record activity completion and guidance on how you provide evidence for that activity.

As you review the activities, think about how you undertake the whole activity including preparation, discussions or collaboration with peers, self-reflection, feedback, and any outcomes that might follow as a result of the activity. These elements of the activity all form part of your CPD and can be



recorded, demonstrating your achievement of relevant and effective CPD.

How to evidence	If you are obtaining formal certification from an organisation other than the RACGP, evidence of enrolment,		
	coursework and/or scheduled examinations may be required. This can be uploaded through Quick Log.

How to evidence	CPD Providers have 30 days to upload your hours. For on-demand content, identify what you viewed/heard, why it was of interest to you, and if/how it was useful to you.

Description	Case review, analysis or discussion can be undertaken formally or informally, independently or with others.	
	Examining ways to improve patient outcomes and multisource feedback are MO whereas the process of	
	giving and receiving feedback (including self-reflection) are RP. Case review/analysis is also a highly	
	effective EA activity to acquire knowledge and develop clinical skills.	
	Random case analysis uses a specific method of case note review, using a random selection of cases,	
	which has proven useful in identifying blind spots or 'unknown unknowns' in a clinician's skills or knowledge.

	arrangements in general-practice, enable multi-disciplinary teams to review the safety and quality of the care		
	that is being provided.		
	Mortality and morbidity meetings are a structured review of case outcomes from presentation to		
	management, to improve systems and processes and clinical expertise in that setting.		
	Team-based care planning / clinical review meetings offer GPs and care teams a similar opportunity to		
	review patient care delivered across multiple settings, considering their whole of person care needs.

Similar activities	Small group learning, Project ECHO, communities of practice, case review/analysis, practice meetings, evidence-based medical journal club.
Activity type	EA, RP (with opportunity for MO)
Description	Small group learning undertaken by a group of peers involving case-based discussions, interaction, reflection, and support. Discussion topics prioritisation depends on participant need. For groups wanting to maximise MO, participants could share their own cases/experiences, review case data, evaluate patient outcomes, and participate in an evaluation of their experience in the PGL.

Reviewing Performance/ Measuring Outcomes Activities

Activity	Audits (including mini audits)
Similar activities	Quality improvement activity, PDSA (Plan Do, Study, Act)
Activity type	MO, RP
Description	Audits use data to evaluate the effectiveness of a healthcare team's (or solo GP's) clinical practices to
	ensure quality and safety of patient care.
	Audits can be time-intensive and whilst predominantly MO activity, can include other activity types. Review
	of current evidence for audit planning, or capacity building to conduct the audit, is EA activity. Conversations
	and quality improvement activities based on audit results tend to be a mix of MO and RP activity.
	Mini audits enable GPs to monitor their care quality and safety using an audit methodology but applied to a
	narrow focus and sample size. Mini audits can be conducted over the course of several clinical days, by the
	GP without colleague involvement, making them ideal MO and RP activity for locums and part-time GPs.

How to evidence	Mini audits require 4-5 sentences that describe your audit scope, the data you gathered, and what you did as
	a result.
	Audits will generate substantial evidence that we advise you retain for three years. Evidence may include
	your audit template and or reflection on results and further action.

Similar activities	Audit, Supervision, Mentoring, Plan, Do, Study, Act (PDSA)
Activity type	RP and MO
Description	Single and multi-source feedback can be a useful tool for GPs to measure outcomes and review
	performance. Feedback can be obtained as part of an Audit/Mini Audit, PDSA, Practice Accreditation or
	Quality Assurance activity. It can also be used to support teaching and learning for early career GPs. There
	are a range of survey tools GPs can use to obtain feedback from peers, patients, team members, and self-
	evaluation.
How to record	Quick Log Use Quick Log to record individual or group evidence
How to evidence	Provide notes that describe the purpose or focus of the feedback, the scope, the method of data collection
	(e.g., survey) and your involvement (whether directly as the recipient of the feedback or as part of the
	practice) and outcomes of the review. For an arranged MSF, a report will be generated. This can be
	uploaded as evidence

Activity type	MO and RP
Description	Activity that involves the evaluation of programs, initiatives, incentives, or projects to determine if the planned
	activity achieved the desired outcomes. Outcomes evaluation could be undertaken for: quality improvement
	activity, teaching, writing, advocacy, clinical advisory and other professional leadership roles.
How to record	Quick Log
How to evidence	Outline the project/initiative you are evaluating, data source and type (qualitative, quantitative, mixed), your
	approach and key evaluation findings.

Activity	Planning self-care (for your health and wellbeing)
Similar activities	Professional Development Planning, mentoring, peer group learning
Activity type	RP and EA

Description	Development of strategies you put in place to manage your health and wellbeing. These could include peer
	support, a debrief with your local Doctor's Health Advisory Service, workshops on maintaining patient
	boundaries, managing conflict, stress and time management. Relaxation activities are not eligible as CPD.

Activity type	A mix of EA, RP and MO
Description	Practice Accreditation is a time-intensive process that provides assurances that a general practice setting meets expected standards for safety and quality. Activity that improves knowledge and skills to complete the accreditation process is EA. Assessment of practice outcomes against standards, report writing / editing, and preparation for site visits is a mix of RP and MO activity.
How to record	Quick Log
How to evidence	Summarise your role in the accreditation process, your contribution and any outcomes/ improvements that will or have been made.

Similar activities	Planning GP self-care and wellbeing
Activity type	RP
Description	In 2023, the Medical Board of Australia requires all medical professionals to complete an annual PDP.
	Developing your PDP will help you set your goals, plan your learning, monitor and review your progress.
How to record	myCPD Home PDP Tool You can use the PDP tool on your myCPD home. It will enable you to save
	drafts and review your PDP at any time. You can also opt to upload a PDP you have developed yourself.
	When finalising your PDP, you will be asked the hours you have spent developing and reviewing your PDP,
	which will be uploaded to your records.
How to evidence	Use of the myCPD home PDP tool will not require you to provide any further evidence.

Activity type	RP (can include MO and EA)
Description	Quality improvement (QI) activities are what you put in place to improve the safety and quality of your care,
	either as an individual or as a practice. QI activity can be generated as action items arising from practice
	meetings, practice accreditation, a Plan, Do, Study Act (PDSA) cycle, audits, or from clinical review meetings
	or case discussion.
	A PDSA is methodical approach to implementing and evaluating quality improvement changes by
	systematically breaking it down into manageable parts. PDSA and audit templates are available in the CPD
	resources

	GP-led Activity Using this form for a PDSA will enable you to summarise your activity, and one GP can
	record the activity for multiple GPs on their behalf

Similar activities	Advocacy, community leadership, clinical advisory roles, media engagement
Activity type	EA, RP and MO
Description	Leadership activities that relate to your scope of practice is recognised as CPD. Preparing for and undertaking your responsibilities may require you to investigate issues, review and compare data, prepare documentation, influence others or participate in a broad range of initiatives. You can log your activity as EA, RP and MO depending on the nature of your role and the activity itself.
How to record	RACGP Work you do with and for the RACGP will be automatically recorded. Quick Log
How to evidence	Add notes to Quick Log that describe the leadership activity, when it occurred, your role and the types of activities that you undertook relating to CPD.

Activity	Mentoring (mentor and mentee)
Similar activities	Peer support, peer group learning, self-care planning, PDSA (Plan Do, Study, Act)
Activity type	RP and EA (can include MO)
Description	Mentoring differs from leadership and teaching as it is a longer-term relationship between a student, registrar or colleague and a more experienced general practitioner, based on shared professional and personal interests. Mentoring can be provided formally or informally, the giving and receiving of feedback can support knowledge and skill acquisition (for the mentee) and teaching and leadership skills (for the mentor).
How to record	RACGP Work you do with and for the RACGP will be automatically recorded. Quick Log
How to evidence	Summarise the relationship, its duration, frequency of contact, nature of the interactions between mentee and mentor. Briefly describe the impact the relationship has on you as the mentor/mentee.

Activity	Research (participating in, or conducting)
Similar activities	Academic research, evaluation, quality improvement activity, PDSA (Plan Do, Study, Act)
Activity type	MO (can include RP and EA)
Description	Research involves either participation (in) or conducting relevant general practice research, and enables the
	development of research skills, reflective and critical thinking, and dissemination of the results of primary
	care research to the benefit of the Australian general practice population. Whilst predominantly MO activity,
	research does involve all three activity types, and will depend on your role in the research activity.
	The informal use of the term research, for activities such as literature review, background reading,
	investigation of current evidence, to inform an audit, PDSA, or developing educational content, is EA activity.
How to record	Quick Log Use for either participation in research and/or conducting research.
How to evidence	From myCPD home, use the RACGP's Activity Guides and Templates to help you conduct and record your
	research activity as CPD.

Activity	Supervised clinical attachment
Similar activities	Supervision
Activity type	A mix of EA, RP and MO
Description	A period of attachment with a health professional (supervisor) who is an expert in a specific area to provide
	an individualised and hands-on learning experience using real cases. Supervised clinical attachments can be
	delivered in a range of settings, from your place of work, other health/care settings. The case-based nature
	of these activities provide opportunity for a mix of activity types for both mentee and mentor.
How to record	Quick Log

How to evidence	Describe the circumstances and location of the clinical attachment, the scope of your supervisory role (time,
	frequency, teaching, any formalised assessment), how you prepared for the role, and how you used
	feedback to review theirs and your own performance (if applicable).

Activity	Supervision
Similar activities	Mentoring, Supervised Clinical Attachment, Teaching
Activity type	A mix of EA, RP and MO
Description	Supervision is a core element of work based medical education for medical students, GPs in training, or GPs
	in other circumstances such as return to work arrangements. Supervision requires the development and
	maintenance of your knowledge and skills. It involves reflection on action through interacting with colleagues,
	deconstructing clinical decisions, sharing and testing ideas and skills. Therefore, supervision and teaching
	activities will meet EA, RP and MO activity types.
How to record	RACGP Work you do with and for the RACGP will be automatically recorded.
	Quick Log For work you do to support GPs in other circumstances
How to evidence	For Quick Log, describe the circumstances of your supervision (such as return to work arrangements,
	APHRA conditions), your supervisory scope (duration, frequency, teaching, any formalised assessment),
	how you prepared for the role, and how you used mentee feedback to review your performance.

Activity	Publication of a Peer Reviewed Paper / Article
Similar activities	Research, Writing / Development of Resources
Activity type	EA and RP
Description	A CPD activity for a published written article or one accepted for publication after going through a peer
	review process. The peer review process can be involved and time-intensive, providing multiple opportunities
	to receive feedback to enhance your article/paper and acquire new knowledge and skills.
How to record	Quick Log
How to evidence	Describe the type of research, your role in the research/ writing team and the activities that you undertook to
	prepare, research, write, review and respond to feedback. Provide a link to the publication (if available)

Activity	Teaching (medical education and assessment)
Similar activities	Lecturing, presenting, medical education delivery, webinar delivery, marking/assessment, examining
Activity type	A mix of EA, RP and MO
Description	There are a wide range of activities that fall under the Teaching umbrella that are a mix of activity types.
	Lecturing, presenting and delivery of didactic materials is EA.
	• Delivery of education such as case discussion, moderation of Q&A, observing / providing feedback is
	RP.
	Examination and assessment are a combination of MO/RP
	Evaluation of feedback received on your teaching is RP
How to record	RACGP Work you do with and for RACGP will be automatically recorded.
	Quick Log For activity undertaken for universities, organisations or CPD providers
How to evidence	RACGP teaching activity will not require evidence. For Quick Log, course outlines, job description, lesson
	plans, schedule, exam roster, marking allocations, could all be suitable evidence.

Activity	Writing / preparing materials / developing resources
Similar activities	Writing of: journals, articles, podcasts, guidelines, reports.
	Preparation/Development of: educational content, materials, patient resources, preparation associated with
	delivery/facilitation of a CPD activity.
Activity type	A mix of EA, RP and MO

Description	Writing and preparation of materials, including the reading you undertake, is predominantly EA. The process
	of editing your writing/materials, to increase its usefulness/impact, through use of self-reflection or feedback
	from others, is RP activity. Gathering data/evidence to evaluate the impact of your writing/materials is MO.
How to record	Quick Log
How to evidence	Attach a copy or link of your writing/materials, or feedback obtained during editing. Write a summary of the
	purpose of your writing, the work involved, and what you learned. Note that this reflection task, of what you
	learned or will do differently because of your writing, is also RP that you can log.
